Towards a Multilingual European Platform for Judicial Auctions

LEILA aims to create a single European marketplace for all judicial sales by delivering a multilingual pilot platform for searching goods to be sold in judicial auctions taking place in the EU

- following the one-stop-shop approach,
- unifying the presentation and delivery of certified data in a centralized way, without intermediaries, and
- easing the European citizens' and companies' access to information on these goods by making it available in different EU languages.



LEILA is a pioneering project focused on fostering the cross-border cooperation in the judicial auctions' domain – a sector currently strongly fragmented at national level with substantially different and quite complicated governing rules across the EU Member States.

To achieve this, LEILA is to

- map stakeholders and define needs-based functional and technical requirements
- develop and deploy a **piloting solution towards a European 'one-stop-shop' marketplace providing information on judicial auctions**
- deliver a EU-wide adoption strategy and a sustainability road map towards a true **European Platform for Judicial Auctions**.

What to expect?

- Simple and intuitive user interface
- Standardized information fields translated in all EU languages
- Automatic up-to-date retrieval of official, certified and reliable information, using the e-CODEX infrastructure
- Pilot integration with the national platforms of Croatia, Czech Republic, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, and Portugal
- Publication facilities for Member States which are currently lacking (a national provider(s), tested by the National Chamber of Judicial Commissioners (France)
- A toolbox for easy adoption by competent authorities across EU
- A solution ready to be integrated with the EU e-Justice Portal

The European Platform for Judicial Auctions is intended to foster the judicial auctions effectiveness and the competitiveness at EU level by benefitting multiple stakeholders.

Potential buyers:

- Certified and reliable information on goods to be sold on judicial auctions
- Real-time up-to-date information, automatically retrieved from national providers
- Unified presentation and delivery of judicial auctions' data
- Intuitive graphic user interface facilitating complex searches
- Comparison of search results
- Available in all EU languages

Professionals and competent authorities selling seized assets on judicial auctions:

- Increased trust of potential buyers
- Faster conclusion of sales
- Wider users' base, increasing the competitiveness, the number of submitted bids per auction, and the number of sold assets
- Increase in the winning price and overall judicial auctions' effectiveness
